Community Relations Council

Funding for Civic Events in Derry

In addition to this funding, on 9th July 2009 the First Minister and deputy First Minister announced a funding package of 85 thousand pounds to promote good relations in Derry. This was for a pilot scheme designed to promote dialogue, good relations and rights by means of a number of civic events in the city. Funding was targeted at the larger festivals in the area which were deemed to have the greatest cross-community capacity.

The following festivals received funding:-

- Maiden City Festival 40 thousand pounds
- Gasyard Wall Féile 15 thousand pounds
- Greater Shantallow / Outer North Area Partnership 15 thousand pounds
- Top of the Hill Féile 15 thousand pounds

All of these events attracted visitors from the City of Derry and its surrounding areas.
