Dar Mr Bum,

To ask the Minister of Justice how much has been spent investigating the theft of ATMs in each of the last five years; and to provide a summary of the outcome of these investigations.

The above mentioned question was placed before the Minister of Justice, who has deemed that this is an operational matter for the Police Service of Northern Ireland. Therefore the Chief Constable has been asked to respond directly.

We are not in a position to provide the specific information requested as such investigations are not specifically costed. The PSNI are committed to dealing with such crimes and a number of prevention, investigative, enforcement and reassurance strands have been taken forward in partnership with the Banking Sector and the Northern Ireland Association for Retail Trade. This strategy has had a significant impact in tackling this type of crime over recent months, with a marked decrease in such crimes.
