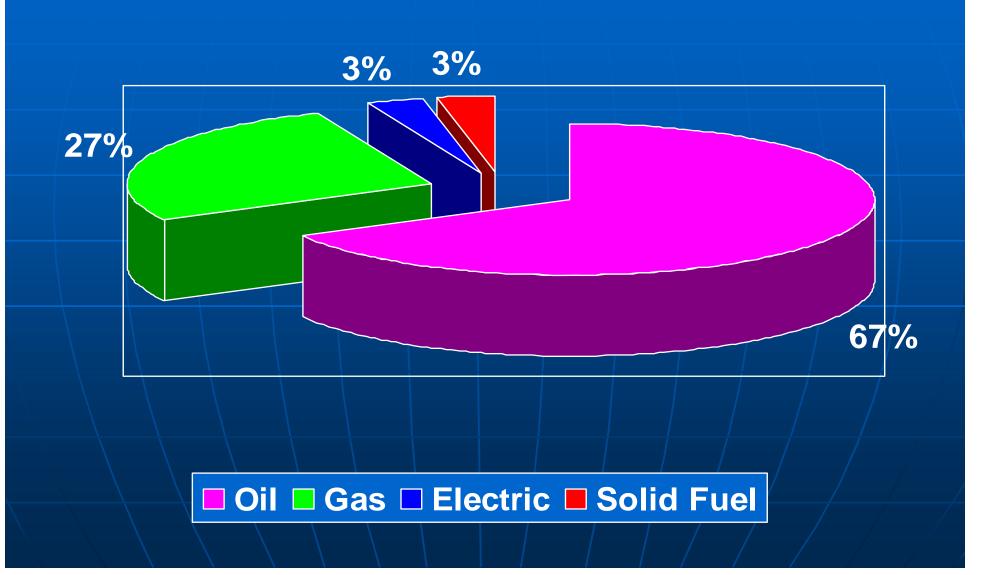

Availability of Natural Gas

Coverage of Natural Gas

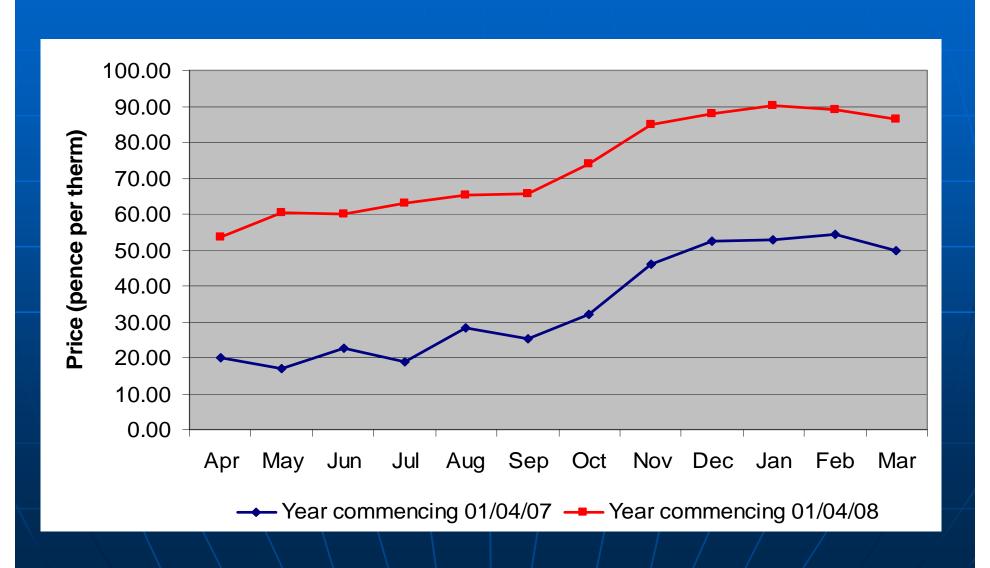
- Greater Belfast Area (Phoenix Licence Area)
 - Natural gas available for connection to 264,000 homes and businesses
 - Circa 123,000 will be utilising natural gas in the Greater Belfast Area by end of 2008.
 - Breakdown of properties circa 114,000 residential and 9,000 businesses
- 10 Towns & Cities outside of Greater Belfast being developed by BGE subsidiary firmus energy

Wholesale Gas Costs

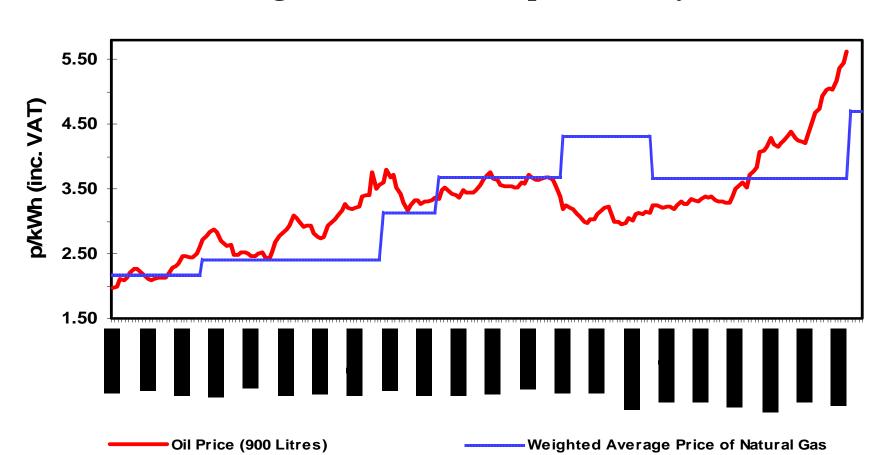


Wholesale Gas Costs

- Summer 08 prices c.63ppt
 - Summer 07 prices c.25ppt
 - Increase of 150%
- Winter 08 prices c.85ppt
 - Winter 07 prices c.50ppt
 - Increase of 70%
- Prompt currently c.58ppt
 - Winter 07 prompt c.55ppt
 - Summer gas more expensive than winter

Average gas bill in Phoenix Area

Average Phoenix Gas Bill

- Our average customer pays £584 per annum (c.£50 per month)
- Phoenix customers use c.25% less gas than their GB counterparts
- GB average customer pays £625 per annum
- While NI prices higher (because of infrastructure issues) efficiency savings mean our average bill is comparable to GB

Payment Methods

- Quarterly Credit (23% of customer base)
 - 4 bills per annum
 - Energy Saver Card Budgeting Tool (21% of quarterly credit customers use this form of payment)
- Direct Debit (24% of customer base)
 - 1 bill per annum
- Pay-As-You-Go (53% of customer base)
 - No premium for using this facility unlike GB

Pay-As-You-Go (PAYG)

- Most popular payment method –
 53% of customer base use PAYG
- PAYG tariff is at same level as standard credit customer, unlike GB where PAYG customers pay up to 31%* more for their energy
- Limited Number of meters can be installed

Gas on Gas Competition

Gas on Gas Competition

- Greater Belfast Area open to competition for large Industrial & Commercial customers for circa 7years.
- Greater Belfast Area open to competition for domestic and small I&C customers since January 2007.
- Other Licence Areas in NI not open to gas on gas competition.

Gas on Gas Competition

- Large Industrial & Commercial
 - Greater Belfast had <u>3-year period</u> of exclusivity from date gas available in the district
 - Other Areas have <u>5-year period</u> of exclusivity commencing on 1st April following the start date of development in that area
